

Texts worth reading!

Questions worth answering!

Work worth doing!

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ipdae BY EDUCATORS FOR EDUCATORS Shift 1: Text Complexity

Qualitative
Text features best judged by human evaluation
Text structure, vocabulary, knowledge demands

Quantitative
What a computer can see and measure
Word, sentence, text length/familiarity

Reader and Task
What an instructor or student does with the text.
Motivation, prior knowledge & experience, lesson task

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ipdae BY EDUCATORS FOR EDUCATORS Shift 2: Text-Dependent Questions

Text-Dependent Questions

Are questions that can only be answered correctly by close reading of the text and demand careful attention to the text

Require an understanding that extends beyond recalling facts

Often require students to infer

Allow students to gather evidence and build knowledge

Provide access to increasing levels of complex text

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Shift 2: Text-Dependent Questions

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Sentence Frames

Guide – pp. 3-9

Use sentence frames to get started writing text-based questions (by standard)

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Shift 3: Content-Rich Nonfiction

Shift 3 – Knowledge: Building knowledge through content-rich nonfiction

- Focus shifts to nonfiction text that constitutes the majority of what people read in college and the workplace
- Focus shifts to teaching knowledge while teaching reading skills




Getting started with unpacking standards - start with the lead standard approach

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ipdae BY EDUCATORS FOR EDUCATORS Integrating Instructional Shifts

Consider Shifts in Instruction




- Focus on text complexity
- Address reading and writing across the curriculum
- Emphasize analysis of informational text
- Focus on writing arguments and drawing evidence from sources
- Emphasize participating in collaborative conversation
- Integrate media sources across the standards
- Focus on academic vocabulary
