

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



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The Three Parts of the FL ESOL Framework:

College and Career Readiness Standards (CCRS)

Academic Content of Reading, Writing, Speaking, Listening and English Language Arts

English Language Proficiency Standards (ELPS)

English Language Skills that ELLs need to know how to use in order to access the academic content of the CCRS

Life & Work Competencies

Functional skills used in the context of daily life and work What students can do with what they know

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Part One of the FL ESOL Framework:

The CCR and ELP Standards Reflect Three Key Advances:

- Complex Text Engage with complex text and academic language
- Evidence from Text Prioritize ability to cite evidence from text across domains of reading, writing, speaking, and listening
- Knowledge from Text Focus on building knowledge through comprehension of contentrich informational text

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Part One of the FL ESOL Framework:

The College and Career Readiness Standards focus on Academic Skills:

- Academic Standards and Knowledge Needed for College and Career Success
- Oral and Written Communication Skills
- Academic Vocabulary
- Informational Text

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


Part Two of the FL ESOL Framework:

The English Language Proficiency Standards focus on Proficiency Skills:

- Provide the linguistic supports, knowledge about language, and skills using language for students to access the CCR Standards
- Underscore connectivity between language and standards-based academic content
- Support academic language development and learning in content-related areas

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Part Three of the FL ESOL Framework:

The Life & Work Competencies focus on Functional Skills:

- Activities students are able to do based on what they know from the CCR and ELP Standards
- Relevant to everyday life and work contexts
- Address all levels of the Adult ESOL course

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



Part Three of the FL ESOL Framework:

The Life & Work Competencies Focus on Nine Subject Areas:
