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What is team-teaching?

In simplest form: teachers working together to greater benefit their students.

Team-teaching provides students with:

a variety of perspectives.a variety of skill sets.a variety of personalities.model professional adult teamwork.





- 1. Students learn more quickly and deeply in teamteaching situations.

What is FICAPS?



- FICAPS: Florida's Integrated Career and Academic Preparation System
- Upshot: Adult Education and Career & Technical Instructors Teaching Together
- This benefits not only Adult Education students, but CTE students as well.
 - Adults with low literacy or math skills were more likely to be unemployed and out of the labor force than those with high skills even if they posses a industry credential.







- Team-teaching can scare many teachers and administrators with the fear of additional prep-time for teachers, but this doesn't need to be the case.

 Some teachers are uncomfortable, at least initially, with their colleague in the room while they teach.

- But, team-teaching can actually be less work, less stress, and more fun for the teachers involved!

- Tag-team teaching can actually lead to less prep and planning for teachers.

Introducing Tag-Team-Teaching!



Tag-team-teaching is a lot like tag-team wrestling:

A pair of wrestlers who fight as a team, taking the ring alternately. One team member cannot enter the ring until touched or tagged by the one leaving.

Tag-Team continued...



In addition to providing the students with a variety of perspectives on a particular topic, tag-team teaching provides a positive example of adults working together.

The way in which each team works together will be different. And, as such, shouldn't be strictly defined, but left open to develop naturally.

Additional time spent together outside of the classroom and offcampus can increase team connection more quickly.

Before expanding beyond your currently classes and teachers to partner with CTE programs team-teach within your Adult Education Program:

Challenge teachers to teach (or assist) outside of their comfort zone.

Have your math teacher and your English teacher teach English together. Then pair them to teach math together.

Health & Nutrition

- reading class
- focus on Health, Nutrition, and Life Science material
- BLS/CPR & 1st Aid Certification
- team-teaching/3hr block





- Two teachers have divided the class period into thirds. 1st and 3rd period devoted to academics; 2nd period focused on certification requirements.

One teacher takes 1st and 3rd periods.

The other teacher using the 2nd period for CPR/1st instruction.



Writing & Computer

Writing & Computers

- language arts/grammar class
- digital literacy/basic computer skills/typing
- team-teaching/divided time
- assignments compliment one another, but the teachers essentially teach separately





Reading & Childcare Certification

Reading & 40hr Childcare Certification

- team-teaching/round-robin
- a group of teachers are taking turns conducting this blended class
- online/in-class blended curriculum
- one "head" teacher instructs half the modules and coordinates additional teachers tag-team plans





TRAMCON (Training in Manufactured Construction)

- three approaches to team-teaching



- the assertive student teamteaching in the classroom
- tag-team teaching in class
- team-teaching in the lab while students for on Habitat for Humanity house



NA (Nursing Assistant)

- ABE/GED Instructor in class with FICAPS students



- participates in all classes
- assists in TLC (Teaching & Learning Center)
- taught NA prep-class focused on study skills and basic medical vocabulary/technical terminology
- conducts additional study sessions with FICAPS NA students

- all extra sessions open to non-FICAPS NA students as well



- Teachers working together to provide the best educational opportunities and depth of knowledge for their students.

- Tag-team-teaching can help integrate goals beyond traditional academics into the classroom as well.
